A Leadership Summit for Asian American Students

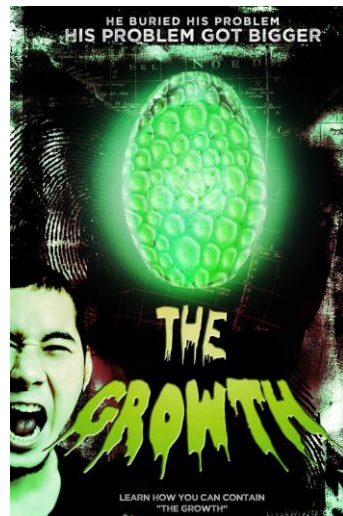

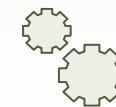
The three-day Summit will help student leaders:

The National Asian American Pacific Islander Mental Health Association, Asian Pacific Development Center, Asian Unity, National APIA Panhellenic Association, and ECAASU invite you to participate in a three day leadership summit at the University of Colorado, Boulder campus. Together they are committed to developing leadership among college students to eliminate the stigma associated with mental health. This three day summit will be held on the beautiful University of Colorado Campus which is located at the base of the Colorado Mountains. The campus is situated in the middle of the country making transportation from either the East or West coast reasonable. We are planning activities that will stretch your mind, open your hearts and get you outdoors to invigorate your body!

The three day Summit will help student leaders develop facilitation and communication skills so they are better able to talk about mental health issues on campus. There will be discussions on a wide range of topics so participants can better understand suicide, depression, binge drinking, bullying, LGBT issues, etc. The workshops will be facilitated by AAPI clinicians who have worked in the community for years and are very familiar with the issues. There is also a strong recognition that mental health is more than just talking about problems and challenges we face. While this is important, mental health is also about developing healthy communities that engage each other in meaningful, creative and fun ways. There will also be plenty of opportunity for participants to talk about how they can create healthy zones on campus and in the community. NAAPIMHA will put together a compendium of activities that can be used by other campuses as we learn from each other.



The Summit is designed to provide plenty of time for in depth discussions while also having an opportunity to get outside. Taking care of a person's physical health is a critical component to one's emotional health. We will therefore build in time for a hike or two to enjoy the outdoors.
